Aims

- translation and exegesis of the Hebrew text.
- developing and improving facility in Old Testament Hebrew.
- demonstrating the insights which a working knowledge of Hebrew can provide.
- highlighting central and distinctive themes and theology in the book or passage.
- discussion of the book's message for contemporary Christian ministry.

The procedure is to focus on important linguistic and exegetical issues in the text, leading to discussion of wider points of exposition and application. Most of those who attend are involved with Christian teaching/preaching in some context, and this is reflected in what is discussed.

No prior preparation is needed to participate in Hebrew Study Days, but the book or passage under consideration is publicised in advance. They require some knowledge of, but not expertise in biblical Hebrew. Those who come to the days range from people with good working Hebrew to those with only the rudiments. They will have learned their Hebrew at different times and with different methods and text books, but all should benefit and find their language skills exercised. No-one's level of Hebrew is exposed to scrutiny during the Study Days!

Detailed written notes comprising a Hebrew text, English translation, vocabulary and grammatical information, are provided on the day for those attending.
