

Hebrew Study Days 2011-2012 : Isaiah

Beginning this year, Hebrew Study Days will each run twice: once at LTS and once at Grace Baptist Church, Halifax (www.gbcnortontower.co.uk). Please ensure you book the right date and venue.

Study Day 1: Servant passages in chs. 42, 49, and 50

Halifax: 10 November 2011

London: 15 November 2011

Study Day 2: Isaiah 6 and 53

London: 6 March 2012

Halifax: 15 March 2012

Study Day 3: Eschatological passages in chs. 55, 65, 66

London: 8 May 2012

Halifax: 17 May 2012

Hebrew Study Days are run by David Green, Lecturer in Hebrew and Old Testament, and Vice-Principal of LTS. They usually follow the following timetable:

NB. At LTS, lunch is included. In Halifax, you will need to bring a packed lunch: drinks will be provided.

Aims

- translation and exegesis of the Hebrew text.
- developing and improving facility in Old Testament Hebrew.
- demonstrating the insights which a working knowledge of Hebrew can provide.
- highlighting central and distinctive themes and theology in the book or passage.
- discussion of the book's message for contemporary Christian ministry.

The procedure is to focus on linguistic and exegetical issues in the text, leading to discussion of wider points of exposition and application. Most of those who attend are involved in teaching and preaching and this is reflected in what is discussed.

No prior preparation is needed to participate in Hebrew Study Days. They require some knowledge of, but not expertise in biblical Hebrew. Those who attend the days have varying ability in Hebrew, but all should benefit and find their language skills exercised. No-one's level of Hebrew will be exposed to scrutiny!

Detailed written notes comprising a Hebrew text, English translation, vocabulary and grammatical information, are provided on the day for those attending.
